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Editorial

It's December again — a season of festivities and celebration. It's time to set up the Christmas tree and put up the lights. It's time to be grateful for God's marvelous gift of his Son and rejoice in the gift of salvation that has brought to the world. It's also time to revel in the music and singing and the dancing, and not forgetting the feasting.

Alas! This year, for many in our place, it has become a time like no other when the Christmas bell may not ring, where there won't be the usual merry-making and rejoicing. The months-long conflict is yet to see the light of day anytime soon. But it is not only those affected by the ethnic conflict for whom Christmas season is going to be gloomy. There are many who have lost loved ones, many more who are going through life's struggles and carrying hurts in their hearts, albeit unknown to others. For them too, the season will be no different from others.

"Peace" was the tiding brought about by the angels to the shepherds out in the fields on that dark, silent night near Bethlehem. The One to come was also described as the "Prince of Peace" by the ancient prophet Isaiah. Indeed, peace is what the world needs right now. Peace is what our land needs more than anything else. And peace is what the broken-hearted could do with more than the dazzling music and hearty feasts.

What, then, is peace? And how may one find it?

Let the One – the Prince of Peace himself – tell us! As recorded by the beloved John, the Prince says thus: "Peace I leave with you... I do not give to you as the world gives" (John 14:27 NIV). Remarkably, there are at least two kinds of peace – peace according to the world and peace which Jesus alone can give. On another occasion, Jesus spoke oddly about peace: "Do you think I came to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but division" (Luke 15:21 NIV). Strangely enough, but surely, these two verses suggest that peace can be a much misunderstood concept.

The philosopher Baruch Spinoza said of peace as: "Peace is not an absence of war, it is a virtue, a state of mind, a disposition for benevolence, confidence, justice." And thus, to those who won't be indulging in the season's festivities — of Christmas carols, dance and feasts — owing to the present conflict, to those whose memories are still afresh with the pain of missing a loved one, or to the rest of us who carry unspoken hurt inside, may we be reminded that even in the midst of the turmoil and heartache, we can still find peace; the kind of peace which the Prince himself can give us, not the peace as defined by the world, but the kind of peace that passes all human understanding — the heavenly peace. We may find it by finding the Prince; we may have it if we have him in our hearts irrespective of our circumstances.
