### >>> COLLEGE EVENTS (JANUARY-DECEMBER)



The End Semester or Senate Examinations went underway from the 2<sup>nd</sup> of April through 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2024.


#### >>> VALEDICTORY/GRADUATION SERVICES 2024














# NEWS LETTER
